II. News from the Faculty

- <u>Vaibhav Diwadkar, Ph.D.</u>, whose paper, Diwadkar, V.A., Bakshi, N., Gupta, G., Pruitt, P.J., White, R., Eickhoff, S.B. (In Press). Dysfunction and dysconnection in cortical—striatal networks during sustained attention: genetic risk for schizophrenia or bipolar disorder and its impact on brain network function. Frontiers in Psychiatry. doi: 10.3389/fpsyt.2014.00050, was accepted for a special issue on "Neuropsychopharmacology of Psychosis: Relation of Brain Signals, Cognition and Chemistry" for Frontiers in Psychiatry. This publication has already generated considerable media attention.
- <u>Steven Ondersma, Ph.D.</u>, has received a new NIDA R34 grant: Computer-based SBIRT for marijuana use in pregnancy Planning a Stage II trial. Funding this grant during this especially challenging fiscal climate at NIH underscores the novelty and impact of his work.
- Richard Young, Ph.D. and Sean Seaman, Ph.D., Dr. Young recently received a large and prestigious joint contract from the Alliance of Automobile Manufacturers and the Global Automakers, 2 separate organizations who cooperate closely. Between them, they cover almost all of the automakers in the world, so this is a great honor to Dr. Young and his team as well as our University to have received this.
- Alireza Amirsadri, M.D., appeared with Dr. Robert Frank, chief executive officer of the Wayne State
 University Physician Group on WDET-FM's the Craig Fahle Show June 16, 2014. They discussed Dr.
 Amirsadri and colleagues recent publication demonstrating potential savings of \$7.5 million per year
 to Medicaid with improved outcome and 90% reduced inpatient hospitalization rates.

- <u>Vaibhav Diwadkar, Ph.D.</u>, Dr. Diwadkar's research study was recently featured in WSU Prognosis. According to his study, brain network interactions between regions that support attention are dysfunctional in children and adolescents at genetic risk for developing schizophrenia and bipolar disorder, shows brain networks supporting attention improperly communicate in children at risk for mental disorders. NO GUNS OR WEAPONS ON WSUPG OWNED OR LEASED PREMISES

To provide for the safety and protection of Wayne State University Physician Group ("WSUPG") staff, physicians, patients and visitors, the possession of a firearm and/or other dangerous weapon ("Weapon") is strictly prohibited on any premises either owned or leased by WSUPG, unless such Weapon is in the lawful possession of law enforcement. Under this policy, all WSUPG employees are prohibited from bringing a Weapon inside their work location or facility.
